

## Annual Report to AHMF 2020

The year commenced with positive thoughts as we had planned two events promoting FHMC and historic motoring. The long awaited AHMF National Motoring Festival was also to be the major event of the year.

Arthur Clisby Picnic Day attracted 150 vehicles ranging from motor cycles to a flat top carrying a vintage car.

Motorfest our annual 10 day motoring festival was again well supported. Each day promoted by a different club has a drive to a collection, museum, farm, winery etc.

The AHMF National Motoring Festival, Albury attracted 60 entries. Covid 19 restrictions came into operation causing some entrants to become bitterly disappointed. These entrants were determined to attend regardless of risk or penalty. Eventually after action by the FHMC Committee the tour was cancelled.

General meetings for April and June were cancelled due to virus restrictions. All further business has been conducted virtually.

FHMC issues all log books in SA and so accountable to the relevant govt. department. A few clubs had become complacent and not supplying Return Sheets for years. A stop was placed on the offenders until the sheets were forthcoming. The department supported the action taken by FHMC. Eventually the required sheets were produced and log book orders processed.

FHMC continues to have cordial relations with the department on all facets of historic motoring.

Club Grants. Fifteen member clubs have received grants to help with expenses incurred promoting historic motoring events.

Junior Grants. Three grants went to people under 26 years to help with their own vehicle restoration.

Due to lack of activities at club and motoring levels, membership fee for the year 2020/2021 have been suspended.
