6. AHMF Website/Newsletter:

Christine Stevens spoke about the Website is stable although two newsletters are to be uploaded to the website. Query about a Racing Accident some years ago, Christine referred query.

Christine asked that all members present approve that Club's postal addresses be removed from the Website, citing that they are no longer relevant, due to postal anomalies and club's using email as a preference for contact.

Albert Budworth asked that the Newsletters Spoke n Hub for 2025 be uploaded to the Website and all the Minutes from Meetings for 2025 be included in his request.

Christine spoke about articles for Spoke n Hub being required for further Newsletters, Christine will hold over Publication of the next Newsletter until content is made available to fill newsletter. The success of the newsletter is the articles circulated widely of past and upcoming events.

7. Robert Shannon Foundation:

Christine posted RSF Flyers to Denise in WA, they have been returned, and Christine would like an update on postal address to re-send flyers. RSF Brochures being circulated at events as most people still don't know about the Foundation and the support young people can receive from the Foundation when restoring a vehicle. Applications for the RSF have closed for this year, applications for next year are open until 31st May 2026, 2 Applications for Trust funding for this year have been received, these will be discussed and voted on prior to the AHMF AGM on Friday 3rd October 2025.

9. Insurance:

Neil has asked two members of Federation Vic to fill in question sheets enabling quotes to be received.

3 dummy applications for Insurance have been forwarded, resulting in quotes supplied would be \$1,000. to Gallagher's and around \$600. to Marsh Insurance.

11. State Council Matters:

Keith Mortimer (AOMC) spoke about their group Insurance policy, having appropriate take-up of the offer from clubs, smaller clubs who normally wouldn't have insurance, they have about six clubs take up insurance through AOMC. Smaller Clubs is based on Member Numbers Category receiving price renewals from Gallagher's who have been exceptionally helpful.

Terry McGrath (CMCWA) spoke about joining the AHMF Zoom Meeting for the first time and attending the AHMF AGM in Melbourne in October.

Terry spoke about the combined clubs premier car show in WA, corporate company sponsorship, the arms and legs help from volunteers on the day with working volunteers, needing more Volunteers and Marshalls to run the event.

Boyd Symington (CMC NSW) spoke about Shannons Sydney Classic event 20 Concourse Cars, multiple entries, regional stream of volunteers on the day at Eastern Creek, on site catering, parking was next day at the drag way site next door to the complex, event to be held on the 16th August 2025, 4 groups organizing the event, \$25 per car entry fee, proceeds to Prostrate Cancer, money donated will be topped up to \$10,000.

Boyd spoke about the Vehicle Standards Certificate VSI 6 in NSW, changes to the requirements for Historic Vehicles, keys for vehicles and no open doors, Military Vehicles coming onto the scheme must have a key start and door lock fitted to vehicles, land rover doors must have a key lock on the driver's door, due to unsecured theft statistics.

Neil Athorn (FVV & CVC V) Spoke about the Bendigo Swap in November 2025 changes to the grounds, the impact that top dressing the oval will have should Bendigo receive rain prior to the swap.

The State Government are spending of 6.5 million over the next two years on renovations at the Bendigo Showgrounds.

Brian Davey (FHMC SA) Brian spoke about conditional registration to wives and partners being transferred within an estate, recipient must be a financial member of a registered club, deceased estate transfer must be included in a will with number plate registration and vehicle particulars specified in a will. Department of Transport frame number, 16 digit number, Motorbikes pre 1989 frame number accepted, after 1989 bikes must have a VIN Plate affixed, Department of Transport will now accept speedos on vehicles registering zero for registration.

Bay to Birdwood are hunting for entries into the event as only 50% have been taken up.

Albert Budworth (QHMC) Albert spoke about the QHMC swap meet on the 18th October 2025 for European & English Vehicles only, Volvo and French parts at the inaugural swap, proceeds to Charity. Bayside City Restorers Club saleability for proceeds on Australia Day, donations distributed locally, the need to promote community events within the community for local distribution of funds in regional areas, Albert spoke about volunteers within the movement helping out at other car events.

12. General Business:

Colin Kiel spoke to Hugh Davis on the current position of the Military Museum. Hugh asked Colin to call him privately during the next day to discuss his concerns.

The data from the recent survey by the University Canberra has been compiled, David will present this at the next AHMF Meeting.
